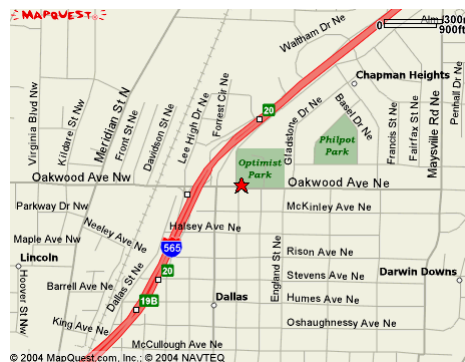
New Website Look
